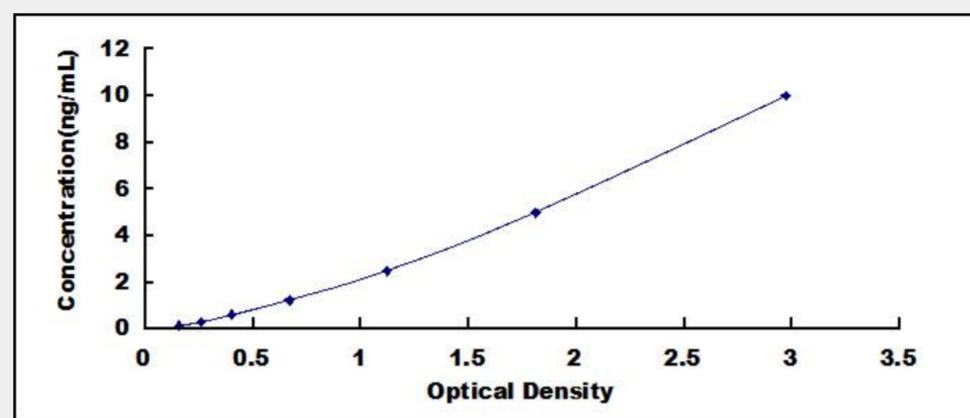

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## Test Principle

The test principle applied in this kit is Sandwich enzyme immunoassay. The microtiter plate provided in this kit has been pre-coated

with an antibody specific to B-Cell Activation Factor Receptor (BAFFR). Standards or samples are then added to the appropriate microtiter plate wells with a biotin-conjugated antibody specific to B-Cell Activation Factor Receptor (BAFFR). Next, Avidin conjugated to Horseradish Peroxidase (HRP) is added to each microplate well and incubated. After TMB substrate solution is added, only those wells that contain B-Cell Activation Factor Receptor (BAFFR), biotin-conjugated antibody and enzyme-conjugated Avidin will exhibit a change in color. The enzyme-substrate reaction is terminated by the addition of sulphuric acid solution and the color change is measured spectrophotometrically at a wavelength of  $450\text{nm} \pm 10\text{nm}$ . The concentration of B-Cell Activation Factor Receptor (BAFFR) in the samples is then determined by comparing the O.D. of the samples to the standard curve.
